A member of the Maintenance team will accompany the exterminator. Residents do not need to be present during the inspection. Apartments will not be skipped in order to ensure each unit is inspected on a quarterly basis.

If you experience a pest issue between scheduled inspections, please submit a Maintenance Work Order. Pest control services are scheduled based on the nature and severity of the issue. In an effort to protect the health and safety of all residents, the use of pesticides is kept to a minimum whenever possible. In many cases, cleaning or removing the source of the issue is sufficient to resolve the problem. The presence of a single bug does not necessarily indicate an infestation.

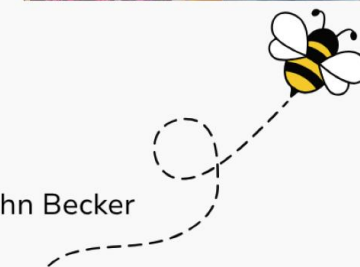

The Valley Hospital holds a monthly blood-draw clinic every third Thursday. Residents must present their Medicare/insurance card and a physician's prescription. Results will be sent to the prescribing physician. You must register and provide copies of insurance and prescriptions to Susan by the Monday of the week of the blood draw. To avoid unexpected out-of-pocket costs, please check with Susan for a list of insurance plans accepted by Valley Hospital Lab.

Smoking

Summer Hill is a smoke-free facility. This includes smoking in any form, including cigarettes, cigars, vaping, and marijuana. Smoke-free buildings will help protect the health of residents and their families. Please inform your guests that smoking is prohibited in the building. You will be held responsible if your guests violate the no-smoking rule. Residents and guests are encouraged to utilize the smoking shelter with smoking receptacles located by each building. Refrain from smoking on the sidewalks or parking spaces. Residents must be 25 feet from the building when smoking.

Please be advised that if staff members observe evidence of smoking in your apartment, they are authorized to conduct an immediate door-to-door inquiry. Should a violation be confirmed, the incident will be formally documented. Please be aware that such actions constitute a direct breach of your rental agreement and will be **addressed legally as a lease violation.**

From Steering Knobs to Shoelaces: Paula Norton's Journey to Independence

For many of us, the ability to tie a shoelace or zipper a coat is an afterthought: a minor beat in a busy morning routine. But for Paula Norton, a Summer Hill resident, these simple actions represent hard-won victories and a newfound sense of freedom. Paula's journey toward recovery didn't start in a gym or a clinic, but with a painful bout of shingles on her right hand. Paradoxically, the condition offered a strange window of opportunity: her hand, which had been functionally closed due to a prior medical issue, began to show signs of opening. Recognizing a "now or never" moment, Paula asked her doctor for occupational therapy (OT) to reclaim the strength she had lost

A Seamless Transition

Paula's recovery began at home with therapist Kim Martin. When her home care concluded, Kim knew Paula had more potential to unlock and recommended the Outpatient Rehabilitation program at Christian Health in Wyckoff. The transition was seamless. From the start, the process was designed to remove stress – Christian Health even handled the insurance verification and provided transportation services to ensure Paula could focus entirely on her recovery.

The Power of Personal Goals

At Christian Health's outpatient program, Paula began working one-on-one with Mary Geen, an occupational therapist whose approach was defined by empathy and partnership. "She was very sweet," Paula recalls. "She took the time to understand my situation and asked me what my goals were." Mary constantly innovated, designing new exercises that Paula could bridge from the outpatient rehab to her own home.

Winning Back the "Small" Things

After three months of dedicated work across home care and outpatient therapy, the results have been life-changing. "I can now do a lot of things with my right hand," Paula says. "I can tie my shoes, zipper my coat, brush my hair and my teeth, and blow dry my hair." Perhaps the most significant win happened behind the wheel. For a long time, Paula relied on a special knob on her steering wheel, driving exclusively with her left hand. Today, she uses both hands, navigating the road with a level of confidence and control she hasn't felt in years.

A Message to the Community

Paula's story is a testament to the fact that rehabilitation isn't just about recovering from an injury; it's about reclaiming your lifestyle. For neighbors or fellow residents who might be hesitant to start their own rehab journey, Paula's advice is simple and direct: **"Try it – it really works!"**

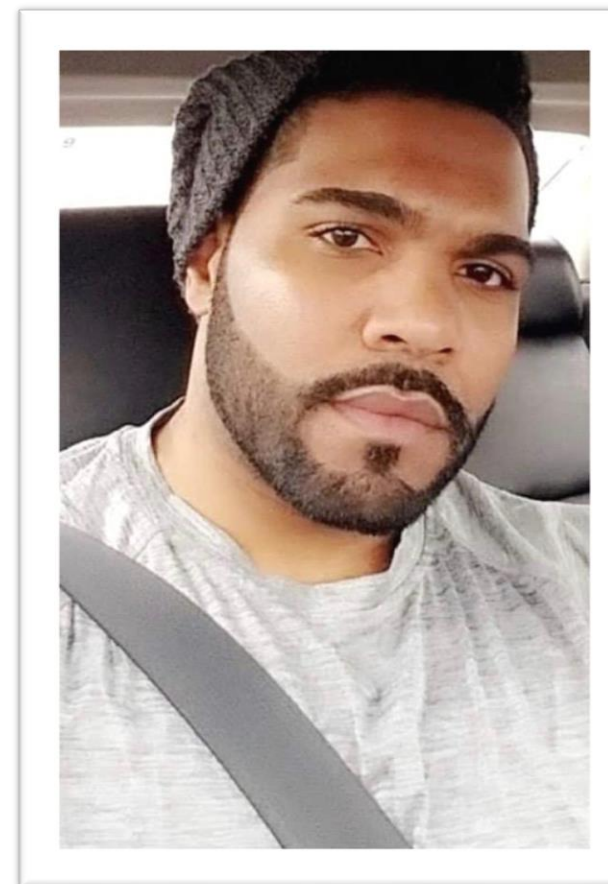
