What to Know About Snow: Updated

Snow plowing at Siena Village of Wayne takes place during snowstorms of two inches or more. To ensure access for emergency vehicles and staff, roadways, sidewalks, common areas, and visitor parking are plowed first.

Resident vehicles and assigned parking spaces will be cleared as soon as reasonably possible, typically within 24 hours after the storm ends. Parking areas must be cleared in an organized and consistent manner, so we are not able to accommodate special requests. If you need your space cleared sooner for work or a scheduled appointment, you will need to do so yourself or make arrangements with a family member or friend.

Residents have two options to have their space and/or car cleared:

Option 1: Move your vehicle yourself. Clear the snow off your vehicle and move your car into a visitor parking space when directed by Maintenance. Visitor parking may not be used before a storm. Once your space has been plowed, you must return your vehicle to your assigned space within 30 minutes.

Option 2: Have staff move and clean your vehicle. Residents who would like staff to move and clean their vehicle must provide their keys along with a check for \$20 for cars or \$25 for vans and SUVs. Checks should be made payable to CHCC at Wayne LLC, placed in a designated envelope, and given to our community coordinator, Sari Rosenfeld, at the main lobby desk between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. No cash will be accepted. Keys will not be accepted outside of these hours or by any other staff.

If a vehicle is not moved when requested, it may result in additional expense. Please do not follow the plow truck in an attempt to have your space cleared sooner.

Snow plowing services are provided by an external contractor. Maintenance staff are only able to assist with moving and cleaning vehicles for residents who have paid the required fee. Your cooperation is important to help ensure a safe and efficient snow removal process for everyone.

30th Anniversary Original Resident Highlights

Dorothy Walter is one of two remaining original residents of Siena Village. Born in Philadelphia, she worked in the Navy Yard, where she met her husband and had the honor of meeting President Franklin Roosevelt when he visited in October of 1944. Dorothy and her husband married and moved to NJ. They had ten children, seven boys and three girls. She is now a proud grandmother and great grandmother. On move-in day Sister Mary Thomas helped Dorothy in her apartment, where she has been the first and only resident thus far. Some of her favorite activities at Siena throughout the years have been the Christmas dinner and attending mass. Dorothy enjoys Wheel of Fortune and doing word searches. When concluding the interview, I asked if she had anything else to tell me, and she said, "I love the United States and God is a miracle worker."

Adeline Hicswa is one of two remaining original residents of Siena Village. Adeline applied to a few different places, saw Siena Village being renovated, and wanted in. She got her wish, and when renovations were complete, she hired a moving van and with the help of Rolando, moved into her apartment, where she has been the first and only resident thus far. Adeline was a graduate of Fairleigh Dickinson University, after which she taught communications in continuing education at Berkeley School and Berdan Institute. She also worked for a judge, where she made \$25 a week, taught Sunday school classes at her beloved church, and finally retired at the age of 89 after still working part-time at JCPenney. Some of her favorite activities throughout the years at Siena include Christmas dinner and pretend travel, where she loves learning about different countries. Adeline spoke about all the changes she lived through, especially being retired, but she was grateful for all the friendships that have blossomed over the years. Adeline also published a book of poetry called "Beyond the Trees," an inspiring collection of poetry that reflects on different themes, like contentment, nature, and faith. The poems reflect on different aspects of life and the human experience. Adeline has written poetry since she was a child, and her poems are songs from her heart.
