Social Security Award Letters Are in the Mail

Social Security and Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits will increase **8.7 percent in 2023**. The Social Security Act ties the annual COLA to the increase in the Consumer Price Index as determined by the Department of Labor's Bureau of Labor Statistics. Social Security and SSI beneficiaries are normally notified by mail, starting in early December, about their new benefit amount.*When you receive your award letter, bring it to the office so a copy can be made and kept on file for your annual recertification, if necessary. Keep your letter in a safe place, since it serves as a proof of current income.

A Message from Rehab

Time to turn the page on the calendar again. December is here, and winter is on its way. There is a chill in the air, the holidays are rapidly approaching, and 2022 is coming to a close. As winter arrives it brings with it colder temperatures and the chance of inclement weather. These are things we have no control over, but let's take a look at some of the things we can do to stay safe and healthy this winter.

- Listen to your local weather reports to be prepared for any inclement weather
- Dress for the weather by: •
 - Layering breathable fabrics
 - Wearing a waterproof jacket or coat
 - Covering your nose and mouth with a scarf to protect your lungs
- Watch for black ice and avoid walking through snow or slush
- Be prepared for power outages by keeping your cell phone charged and having the following on hand:
 - A flashlight and extra batteries
 - A battery-operated radio
 - Nonperishable food and bottled water
 - An adequate supply of medication
 - Warm clothes and blankets
- If you drive, remember to:
 - Check your battery, antifreeze levels, tire tread and, pressure and wiper blades/fluid
 - Keep emergency supplies, including a blanket, first-aid kit, and a scraper/shovel
 - Consider a subscription to AAA or Roadside Assistance
- Protect yourself against colds and the flu by:
 - Washing your hands often
 - Covering coughs and sneezes
 - Getting plenty of sleep
 - Staying hydrated
 - Avoiding crowds or wearing your mask when out in public areas
 - Getting your flu shot/COVID-19 vaccine 0

Snow Removal Policy

Snow plowing at Summer Hill takes place during snowstorms of two inches or more. The Summer Hill Maintenance team is responsible for plowing the parking lot roadway. The Maintenance team will also be plowing the parking spaces this year. Sidewalks, common areas, and visitor parking spaces will be plowed and shoveled before resident parking spaces to allow emergency vehicles and staff access to the building. Resident vehicles and spaces will be cleared as soon as reasonably possible.

Residents have two options for having their space cleared.

- Maintenance team.

Please do not ask the Maintenance team for priority in clearing off your vehicle and/or space. All drivers are required to clear their vehicle within 24 hours. Your cooperation is critical for the safety of all residents. If you do not clear your vehicle and move it to have your space plowed or clear the parking space yourself, it may result in an additional expense. Summer Hill is not responsible for any injuries incurred on the premises due to inclement weather. Please use caution when leaving the building.

Don't Miss Your Holiday Cards and Packages!

US Postal Service mailboxes are located in the lobby of each building. Your mailbox number is the same as your apartment number. Outgoing mail can be dropped into the letter box near the mailboxes. Please do not wait in the area of the mailboxes while the mail carrier is sorting mail. Please adhere to the following.

- Pick up your mail, including packages, in a timely fashion. If you are unable to get your mail, ask a friend or family member to get it to you.
- If you are going away, follow proper procedure and request directly with the post office to have your mail stopped or forwarded.
- The US Postal Service will deliver packages to the mailbox area. All other shippers will leave packages in the vestibule of your building.
- Contact the post office at (973) 839-3811 or the sender of the package with any specific issues regarding mail delivery. The Summer Hill team is unable to get into the mail room or resolve any resident issues regarding mail delivery.
- Unless you have permission, do not pick up packages for your neighbors.
- If you notice a package for the wrong building in your lobby, leave a note on the package so the postal carrier can bring it to the correct building the following day.

• Clear off your own vehicle: Residents will be contacted by telephone by the Maintenance team and given approximately 30 minutes to clear off their car and move it to a visitor space so their space can be plowed. Residents are not permitted to save parking spaces with cones or other items. These items will be removed and disposed of by the

• Have your vehicle cleaned and space cleared by staff: Place your \$20 check made payable to Summer Hill of Wayne, LP in an envelope with your name, apartment number, and car keys in the snow removal box located in the lobby of each building. DO NOT put in the rent box. A member of the Maintenance team will return your keys when complete.
