Services will alternate between crack-and-crevice treatment in the kitchen and bathroom and a visual inspection. Howell Jones, Assistant Superintendent, or Gabriel Wong, Maintenance Team Member, will accompany the exterminator. Residents should be present for the exterminator. Summer Hill Renovation Update

Summer Hill One

Renovations in the lobby and new exterior stairs are ongoing. Residents will need to continue using the side door to enter and exit the building until construction is complete. We apologize for the inconvenience and anticipate the new entrance being open by early fall.

Summer Hill Two

Apartment renovations are ongoing in Summer Hill Two, with 33 apartments expected to be complete by August 30. As a safety reminder, residents are not permitted to enter apartments under construction.

Parking Lot Reminders

- Obey the 5 mph speed limit and observe stop signs.
- All residents are required to utilize only their assigned parking space. Residents are not permitted to park in any other area of the parking lot, such as staff or visitors.
- Residents with a handicap placard or plate have been provided with prime parking spaces due to documented medical disabilities and should be using those spaces.
- For the convenience of our residents, a bench and chairs will be placed in the new parking lot once planting and irrigation is complete.

A Message from Rehab

Greetings from rehab! It's time to turn the page on the calendar again – September is here and fall is approaching. Hope everyone is ready to enjoy some cooler weather and the colorful foliage. September is Healthy Aging Month – an annual opportunity to focus our attention on the positive aspects of aging.

Here are a few steps to healthy aging!

- Get your regular checkups and annual physicals include your primary physician, eye doctor, and dentist.
- Stay social make an effort to stay in touch with family and friends to avoid feeling isolated or bored.
- Keep your brain active read the newspaper, do puzzles, take up new hobbies, join a book club, or socialize.
- Maintain a healthy diet watch your portion size and eat plenty of fresh fruits and vegetables, lean meats, poultry, grains, and beans. Avoid excessive processed foods.
- Get your exercise go walking or swimming or join an exercise group. Even dancing can be good exercise.
- Pay attention to your posture stand and sit up straight.
- Get plenty of sleep the recommendation is eight to nine hours.
- Stay hydrated.

Staying active and taking care of your health is the best gift you can give yourself.

Please remember that the rehab team offers physical/occupational and speech therapy as well as some additional programs right here at Summer Hill to promote health and wellness. Lockboxes

Lockboxes for your keys are available for purchase through Summer Hill. The lockbox will be installed by the maintenance staff and you can choose your personal 4-digit code. You can share this code with friends and family if you would like them to have access to your apartment. It's also a great way to get into your apartment quickly if you don't have your keys, no need to wait for the maintenance staff to let you in!

If you would like to purchase a lockbox, place a check into the Rent Box in the amount of \$40.00 made payable to Summer Hill of Wayne II, LLC. Once the office receives your check, we will notify the maintenance staff to have the lockbox installed.

If there is a lockbox already installed outside you apartment when you move in please speak to maintenance for further instructions.

Laundry Room Basics

As a shared common space, we ask that all residents are respectful and considerate when using the laundry rooms. Please keep in mind the following:

- Residents are permitted to utilize laundry rooms on other floors.
- Laundry detergent options include laundry pods (place on top of clothes toward the front of the drum), powdered detergent (place in the drum, not in the dispenser with clothes) and liquid detergent (place only 1/8 to 1/4 cup in the dispenser).
- Powdered bleach goes in the drum.
- Fabric softener can be placed in the dispenser.
- Clean dryer lint traps after each use.
- Do not overload the machines or they will not wash or dry properly.
- Wipe each machine out and clean dryer lint traps after each use.
- Do not leave cleaning materials or laundry in the laundry room except when doing laundry.
- Do not deposit any refuse in the laundry room trash container except normal trash incurred from laundering.
- Do not use more than one washer or dryer at a time so that all residents have an opportunity to do their laundry.
- Remove your laundry as soon as the cycle ends.
- If an aide or family member does your laundry for you, please make sure they are aware of the laundry room policies.
- Any issues or concerns should be brought to the attention of the office.

If you have any issues with the machines, residents should follow these steps:

- Write down the ID number on the machine.
- Call (201) 848-5848 and press 4 to report the problem.
- If you reach voicemail, please leave a message indicating the machine number and the problem.

The Summer Hill team will alert the laundry company that a repair is necessary by doing an online work order. If you have lost money when doing laundry due to an issue with the machine, you can request a refund online at https://www.cscsw.com/refund-request/.
